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## *A Note from Pastor Robin*

Beloved People of God,

As we come into February, we come back to Lent. Last year, just a few weeks into Lent we entered a rushed lock down and we have yet to fully come out. As I ponder this, I remember that the Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years. We have been wandering, in our own way, for just one year. And it is no small thing. In a recent conversation, I heard someone say: 'It feels like we never left Lent.' My heart jumped as this truth resonated within me.

Maybe it does feel like we never left Lent. Maybe we haven't. Maybe we need this season even more, to sit in the dust, to let oil anoint Jesus, and us too. Maybe as we come back to this season, it will connect even more powerfully as we look and long for a new day – for Easter hope, right now.

This year, my goal is to keep Lent simple. With so much tension, stress and change through this last year, I have heard so many mention that their minds feel foggy. Mine does too. Thus on our journey through Lent we will focus on everyday things like bread, coins and oil. Jill J. Duffield wrote a devotional called *Lent in Plain Sight*. My hope is that these everyday tangible things will ground us every day and point us back to scripture again and again. You will see in this newsletter an invitation to bring all of these objects together for your own worship. You will also see two ways of engaging with God every day, as we offer you two options for daily devotionals. Find a way to journey through this season. It is an opportunity for all of us, to journey through suffering, with Christ, and to God – again.

Lent is a season for slowly turning to God, as we pull out our laments and our struggles. Seeing the struggles of Christ and knowing – again – that God is truly with us, in every age, every time. For me, I feel this is a year to dig through my heart and mind and soul, and unbury the hope (and yes the joy) that, in Christ, always remains. I think I need it this year. Maybe you do too.

Come again to God.

Come again to the deep season of Lent; where tears flow, questions are unearthed, and hope comes from the most unexpected place.

Come again and follow Jesus, to the cross.

May it lead us through the darkness and back into the light.

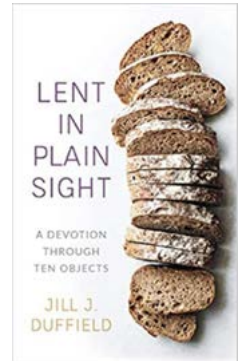

We will begin on Ash Wednesday with DUST.

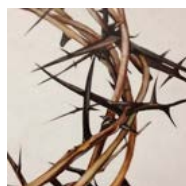
Then on each following Sunday of Lent we will focus on:

You are invited to create a place to gather these symbols, almost like we do with an Advent Wreath. You might put it in the space where you worship online, or where you pray most often, or even your dining room table. You could gather these, one at a time, for each week, or prepare for the whole season, and gather them all at once. They will tie into worship and to a daily online video devotional.

The symbols will guide us through Christ's journey as we connect these everyday things to Lenten scriptures. May these simple, everyday things, ground you and guide us through Lent.

I'm sure most of you remember our dear Fred Grun, long-time member of St. Andrews, who passed away in 2017. And many of you will also remember his niece, Rear Adm. Margaret Grun Kibben, an ordained PCUSA minister who was for many years the U.S. Navy's chief chaplain. Margaret was a guest preacher at St. Andrews and visited occasionally with her dad, Bill Grun.

Margaret was sworn in as the first female chaplain of the House of Representatives on Sunday, January 3. She was called on only days later to pray and minister during the attack on the Capitol on January 6. ## SESSION NOTES

The regular meeting of Session was held on Tuesday January 5<sup>th</sup> at 7pm via ZOOM. As it was Epiphany Eve, Pastor Robin opened the meeting with a reading of Matthew 2:10-12 and a devotion regarding the Wise Men. She encouraged us to keep our eyes on the light of Christ.

The COVID Task Force recommended that due to the uptick in COVID numbers in the Lebanon area, we continue with the recording of worship services up through February 7<sup>th</sup>. The Session approved this recommendation, amended to include all meetings be held virtually during this time as well. The Congregational Meeting, normally held on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in January will be postponed until after we begin meeting for worship in person again.

The Session also approved an Ash Wednesday service to be held either in person or recorded (decision to be made at a later date). A time will also be established for those who are interested to come to the church if they wish to participate in the imposition of ashes. More information will be forthcoming. All other Session committee reports were received. The Session also affirmed support and approval for Rebecca Lister in completing her SPM (Supervised Pastoral Ministry) course with St. Andrews during the spring semester 2021. The Worship Committee of Session will serve as the layperson advisory committee for her in this endeavor.

The next regular meeting of Session will be held on February 2 at 7pm via ZOOM. The meeting was adjourned with prayer.

*Love...bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things,

*1 Corinthians 13: 7-8*

*I have chosen this meditation based on 1 Corinthians 13 for the February article because it speaks so eloquently of love and is one of my most favorite scriptures.*

*What a truckload of responsibility and potential for pain we take on when we love another human being: all the dangers of misunderstanding, of betrayal, or indifference, and ultimately, of loss.*

*To more than balance those dangers, we feel the possibility of life made rich through sharing experiences with another – of physical and spiritual warmth and communion, of enriched understanding and common achievement, of a stay against loneliness and isolation.*

*Most of us have no trouble opting for love.*

*But then, to have invested so much of our life's energy in the life of a loved one – and then to find that loved one gone! Is it any wonder we are, for a time, laid low?*

*This is where the St. Andrews Grief Support Group can be of help. The people who come to these meetings have all loved and have all experienced death, some more than once, and have experienced these feelings of extreme sadness and loneliness. Yes, we have all been “laid low” by our intense grieving for a period of time. We help each other work through these feelings by sharing our stories and our experiences, by offering ideas and suggestions, and expressions of hope to those who are feeling especially low. We learn through sharing that these feelings are “normal” – whatever “normal” is! – and learn that we are not alone with what we are experiencing.*

*No matter how recent or how long ago the passing occurred, if you or someone you know could benefit from meeting with our group, please do not hesitate to join us or to invite your friend to come join us. We welcome anyone, whether members of St. Andrews or not. Our meetings are usually held on the 2nd Thursday of the month, at 2:00 PM, in Cassel Chapel. The meeting in February will be on February 11, and we will likely go as a group to celebrate Valentine's day, which has become our February tradition. Watch for more information about that. Then in March we will be back to our usual meeting time of 2:00, on March 11. Please feel free to come join us – to share, to learn, to listen, to cry, to laugh – we will be happy to see you!*
